written the whole of my said plantation and all other lands lying on the easternmost side of Egg Harbor River but what is before advised with the meadows before excepted to be restricted as aforesaid, hereby I devise to my three sons Samuel Hickman George A. Hickman & Thomas W. Hickman apportion all the marsh I purchased of John Estell in Weymouth Township bounding on Egg Harbor River on the West side opposite the plantation where I now dwell to be equally divided between them Samuel to have the lower end George A. is to have the middle & Thomas W. Hickman the upper during their lives restricted as aforesaid severally I devise that my <sup>third</sup> son pay my six daughters as follows to Elizabeth Scull One hundred Dollars in cash and Penruddick and Joyce Perkins Fifty Dollars each and Mary Steelman ~~and my~~ Steelman and Hannah Dennis Two hundred and fifty Dollars each in one year after my deceas. Eighthly I devise that my three sons aforesaid keep up his individual part of the bank crossing his meadow or his grass to be sold by the party or parties repairing the same in the same order as the law prescribes no like case, And if any of my children should die before me I devise the same to their children to be divided between them in the same proportion as by law it would have been divided had he held the same in fee simple and dies intestate Ninthly all the residue of my Personal Estate after my just debts and funeral charges are paid I order that the residue be equally divided between my three sons Marc and Marc alike Tenthly I do hereby constitute and appoint James English Samuel Hickman and Thomas W. Hickman sole Executors to this my last Will and Testament.

Evidence and proceedings in probate of this Will reduced to writing by the Register of said Orphan's Court, upon <sup>application</sup> of the Counsel of the Plaintiff to the Court.

Testimony taken in respect of the Will -

Peter Birch A witness called on the part of the Testator being duly sworn, saith - "I was acquainted with Thomas Hickman of Egg Harbor Township now deceased, I remember Thomas Hickman calling me on to witness the execution of his Will, at his dwelling house in the Township of Egg Harbor, it appears that I witnessed the execution of a paper which he called his Will, (being then the paper in question, marked Exhibit A. on the part of the Will) the signature at the bottom is my hand writing as a witness, that is the paper which was called in to witness, I recollect my name wrote as a witness, I recollect that Joe Dennis was present as a witness (the Counsel of the executor here objected to the Counsel of the Respondents upon the examination in chief, in the first instance, propounding particular questions as to the mode of executing the Will, and insisted that the only legal mode, after bringing the witness into the presence of the testator, and to the object of his being there, was to ask him what was said or done by the testator or witness); The court being of the opinion that the questions already put are legal and proper, they are also of the opinion that the Counsel of the Respondents, have a right to go on and ask any legal & proper questions which concur to the establishment of the execution of the Will - ) the witness further saith to the following questions

Question - Do you recollect any other person being present at the execution of the Will, but Joe Dennis?

Answer - I recollect James English being present -

Question - Do you recollect Howard Hewitt being there?

Answer - I do not -

Question - Do you recollect seeing either Joe Dennis or Howard Hewitt subscribe their names to the Will?

Answer - I do not recollect it -

Question - Who called upon you to witness the Will?

Answer - The old Captain himself, Thomas Hickman, he came out into the kitchen and called me in -

Question - Was Thomas Hickman in the room at the time you subscribed your name to the Will?

Answer - He was, he went in with us -

Question - Do you recollect seeing Thomas Hickman subscribe his name?

Answer - I do not recollect it -

Question - How long has it been since the Will was executed?

Answer - Something near two years -

(And being cross examined further saith)

I recollect Joe Dennis was in the kitchen with us, James English was in the room with the testator, I saw the roll on the table when I first went into the room, the table stood near the fire
