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Will of Adeline Woodburn

I, Adeline Woodburn of Hammonton, Atlantic County, New Jersey make this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills made by me.

After payment of my just debts and funeral charges, I bequeath and devise as follows,

The use or income of all my property is to be given to my Brother Samuel Woodburn of Boston Massachusetts, and my Cousin Sarah Doolittle of Paelehtun Massachusetts, during their lives, in the proportion of three fourths to the former and one fourth to the latter, should the said Sarah Doolittle die before the said Samuel Woodburn the whole of said income is to be given to him the said Samuel, should he die first the whole income is to be divided among the said Sarah Doolittle and my Nieces Nettie Woodburn and Josephine H. Woodburn each one third, should both said Nieces survive said Samuel and Sarah then said income is to be divided equally between them should only one of said Nieces survive the said Samuel and Sarah, then one half the income shall be given to such surviving Niece and the remaining half may be divided among my surviving Nephews and Nieces children of my Brother Samuel or their descendants or if anyone of said Nephews or Nieces so elect, one half my property shall be so divided instead of one half the income, on the death of either the Niece or the other half shall be so distributed, should said Sarah, and only one of said Nieces Nettie and Josephine H. survive said Samuel, said Sarah and such surviving Niece shall each have one third the income and the other third the income or one third the property
