Charles W. Carr Jr Sworn, I live at no 218 South Street - Philadelphia I knew Mary Jane W. Conly in her lifetime she lived on Bainbridge Street above Third St. I was a subscribing witness to her will.

It was executed in her house, I do not remember how long it was before her death. The contents of the will were made known to me at that time, a man named Thompson was also a subscribing witness, I and Mr. Thompson witnessed the will at her request I remember who was named as Executor.

George W. Kendrick Jr was named as executor. The will was read to her in my presence, I read the will Mr Scanlan was present I looked over Mr Scanlan while he was reading the will and read to myself as Mr Scanlan read aloud.

I am a member of the Bar, I was called upon to draw a will of Mary Jane W. Conly I did so November 11, 1879. I took note of the disposition she wanted to make of her property I read the notes over to her & she approved of them, I left the house went home drew the will and returned in about an hour, I read the will to her in the presence of Mr Carr and Mr Thompson. It was executed in my presence and in the presence of those two as subscribing witnesses It was read over to her by me in their hearing and when reading Mr Carr looked over my shoulder and read to himself as I read aloud I produce the draft of the will as prepared by me (annexed

hereto marked exhibit "A" The will as written out and signed and witnessed was the same as this George W. Kendrick Jr was appointed executor the will remained in my possession for a time and on the thirteenth day of July 1880 I delivered the will to her and took her receipt which is hereto annexed marked exhibit "B"
