

I, Jane S. Platt, of Waterbury, New Haven County, Connecticut, formerly of Hammondon, Atlantic County, New Jersey, being of sound disposing mind and memory, do make and ordain, this my last will and testament, in manner and form following, hereby revoking and annulling any and all other and former wills and codicils, by me, at any other time heretofore made;

First- I will and direct- that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid and discharged by my Executor, hereinafter named: And it is my will that my said Executor shall appropriate for the expense aforesaid, and for the erection of a suitable monument at my grave, the interest I may own, at my decease, in the "Worksmans Loan and Building Association," of Hammondon aforesaid, before using any other portion of my Estate for the purposes aforesaid.

Second- After payment of my just debts and charges and expenses mentioned in the "First" clause of this, my will, I give, devise and bequeath, to my son, Joseph F. Platt, of Waterbury, New Haven County, Connecticut, one half of my Estate, of every name and kind, and wheresoever the same is, or may be situated, to be his and his heirs forever.

Third- All the rest, residue and remainder of my Estate, I give devise and bequeath to the several children of my late daughter, Nettie Patton, deceased- to wit- Alfred Patton, and Myra Patton, in equal portions, share and share alike, to be theirs and their heirs respectively, forever.

Fourth- I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint Alfred S. Platt, of Waterbury, New Haven County, Connecticut, Executor of this, my last will and testament.
