 Third All the rest residue and remainder of my estate, I give devise and bequeath unto the Fidelity Insurance Trust and Safe Deposit Com-
 pany of the City of Philadelphia its successors and assigns in trust to invest and keep the same invested with power from time to time to change investments and again to reinvest, and in making investments, their discretion shall not be limited or restricted to such securities as Invo-
 ters may be restricted to by law but they may with the consent of the execu-
 tive trust for the time being select any stocks or other securities they may deem advisable, and to pay over the net income and profits unto my
 Son Alexander Hensley for and during the period of his natural life for his maintenance and support and so that the same shall not be
 liable or responsible for his debts contracts or engagements and without power on his part of anticipation or alienation; and from and imme-
 diately after his death to pay over the net income and profits thereof unto Florence and Elizabeth Hensley children of the said Alexander
 Hensley for and during the period of their natural lives and the life of the survivor of them for their and each of their maintenance and support and so that the same shall not be liable for their or either of their con-
 tracts or engagements and without power on their part or either of them of alienation or anticipation. Provided however that if Emily Hens-
 ley the wife of said Alexander Hensley shall survive him the one third part of said net income and profits shall be paid to her for and during the term of her natural life for her support and maintenance, and so that the same shall not be liable for her contracts or engagements and without power on her part of alienation or anticipation and upon the death of the said Emily Hensley the whole of the said net income and profits shall be paid to the said Florence and Elizabeth as above directed and as would have been the case under the above direction of the said Emily Hensley had not survived the said Alexander Hensley. And upon the death of the said Florence and Elizabeth Hensley respectively in trust to hold the one half of the principal of my said residuary estate for the use of their respective last wills, or any instrument in the nature of a last will signed by them respectively, and in default of such respective last wills or instruments in the nature thereof in trust for such person or persons as would have been entitled to such principal if the said Florence and Elizabeth had died each of them possessed of the one half of said prin-
 cipal absolutely and in her own right.

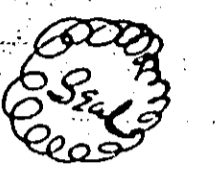
I nominate constitute and appoint my Sister Caroline West
