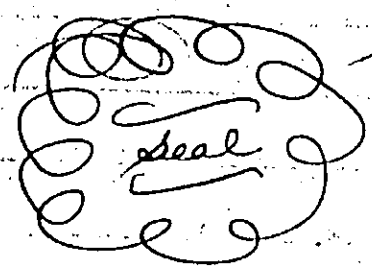

1115 Will of Frances H. Metz

Be it remembered that I, Frances H. Metz of the City of Philadelphia, widow being of sound mind memory and understanding praised be the Lord for the same have thought proper to make and hereby do make my last will and testament in manner following that is to say:

First. I will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be duly paid and satisfied.

Item I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Blanche Myers the sum of two hundred dollars cash.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my sister Mary Jane Tomlinson all my clothing and wearing apparel.

Item I give and bequeath unto my two sons Charles C. Watson and Henry C. Watson my Diamond Ear Rings each to have one Ear Ring.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Harry C. Watson my Parlor and Bed Room Furniture complete, including Piano, Bed, Bedding and carpets.

Item I will that all my household effects (not included in the above bequests) my place of business Fifth and Vine streets Philadelphia and all my property at Atlantic City State of New Jersey be sold at public sale as soon as convenient after my death and be converted into cash money and the same to be equally divided between my two sons Charles C. Watson and Henry C. Watson their heirs and assigns forever, share and share alike.

Item all the rest residue and remainder of my estate real, personal and mixed whatsoever and wheresoever of which I may die seized possessed or entitled to, I give devise and bequeath unto my two sons Charles C. Watson and Henry C. Watson their

heirs and assigns forever share and share alike.

Item I hereby nominate and appoint my two sons Charles C. Watson and Henry C. Watson Executors of this my last will and testament.

Lastly I hereby revoke all former wills by me made and declare this only to be and contain my last will and testament.
