

income, interest and profits thereof, and the net amount of said income to pay over half yearly to my daughter, Harriet J. Huey, to and for her sole and separate use, and upon her individual receipt or written order thereof, whether she be covert or sole for and during her natural life. And I further direct and enjoin that neither the principal of said trust, nor the interest or income thereof, shall be liable to the debts, contracts or engagements of my said daughter, whether covert or sole, or to those of any husband she may have, or to any charge, incumbrance, assignment or anticipation thereof, or to be attached, levied upon or taken in execution upon any legal process whatever, and I further expressly provide that, in case my said daughter should marry and survive her husband, the trust hereby created for her sole and separate use, free from all debts, contracts and engagements, shall not cease and determine, but shall continue in full force and effect during such coverture and during any further coverture with another husband, and so long as he shall live;

Provided, however, that it shall be lawful for my said daughter, and express power and authority to that effect is hereby given to her to dispose by any last will and testament or writing in the nature thereof, duly executed by her in the presence of two or more credible witnesses, of the sum of five thousand dollars out of the said trust fund, and in default of such disposition by will, the same shall pass into and form part of my residuary estate, and, in further trust, from and after the decease of my said daughter, if she should leave lawful issue surviving her, to hold fifteen thousand dollars of said trust fund for the use, benefit and behoof of any and all of said lawful issue, and if more than one, in equal shares applying the interest, dividends and income thereof to and for the education, maintenance and support of said child or children, equal if more than one; and on their respectively attaining the age of twenty-five years, to pay over the whole of said sum to the said child, if there be but one, or its proportionate equal share if there be more than one, and as to the remaining ten thousand dollars of said fund, on the decease of my said daughter, to pay the same to my son Samuel B. Huey, to hold in trust and keep invested safely for the benefit of his children adding the income to the principal

until his oldest son shall attain the age of twenty-five years, at which date the trust fund shall be ascertained, principal and accretions and divided according to the amounts hereinafter stated for each child named, adding to its share a portion of said accretions in proportion to its share in the fund which produces the same. At which time Arthur B. Huey shall be paid his share, as above indicated, and each of the other children named shall be paid its proportionate share with the subsequent accretion as they respectively attain the age of twenty-five years. The proportion each child shall inherit of said trust shall be as follows, viz: Arthur Baird, Twelve hundred and fifty dollars, William Abrams, Twelve hundred and fifty dollars, Emma Harry two thousand and dollars, Samuel Culbertson three thousand dollars, Malcolm Sidney Twelve hundred and fifty, and Howard Hunt twelve hundred and fifty dollars. If my daughter, Harriet J. Huey, should die without leaving any lawful child or children, I hereby order and direct my said trustee to pay to my son, Samuel B., ten thousand dollars in addition to the before-mentioned sum of ten thousand dollars, to be added by him to the before-mentioned trust, to be invested in the same manner as he is directed to invest the sum of ten thousand dollars, and to proportionately increase the amounts thus left to each child as follows: Arthur Baird, twenty five hundred dollars; William Abrams twenty five hundred dollars; Emma Harry, four thousand dollars; Samuel Culbertson, six thousand dollars; Malcolm Sidney twenty five hundred dollars, and Howard Hunt twenty five hundred dollars, said amounts with accretions to be held invested and paid over upon the same plan on their each attaining the age of twenty-five years. And in the event of my daughter not leaving any lawful issue at her decease I further direct my said trustee to pay out of the said trust fund to the following religious or charitable organizations the following sums viz: Franklin Reformatory Home, five hundred dollars; Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children three hundred dollars; Philadelphia Bible Readers Society, of which Mrs. A. M. Smith is President, one hundred dollars; Midnight Mission, of which Rev. Samuel Appleton is President one hundred dollars; North Fund of which Hon. John Welch was or is President, one hundred dollars; Christianian Children's Society
