 and numbered 1410 Parrish Street in the City of  
 Philadelphia and also a house and lot of Ground  
 situate on the East side of American Street South  
 of Oxford Street and numbered 1533 American Street  
 in the City of Philadelphia, To have and to hold and  
 enjoy the same unto the said Ann Virginia Vondenslager  
 her heirs and assigns, to and for her  
 and their only proper use and behoof forever, While I  
 leave these properties unfettered absolutely and  
 freely to my said daughter it is my earnest desire and  
 wish that she will not encumber them or allow them  
 to be come charged with any mortgage or debt of any  
 kind, but that she will take care of them for herself  
 and keep them as a safeguard against want, and I  
 make this request only as an appeal to her good judgment  
 and with loving solicitude for her welfare,  
 Item From and immediately after the decease of  
 my said wife, Margaret Gunnodo, I give and bequeath  
 unto my daughter Susan P. Groves, wife of Robert  
 M. Groves, my house, office and lot of Ground situate  
 at the North East corner of Broad and Almoe Streets,  
 and numbered Eight hundred and thirteen North  
 Broad Street, also the house and lot of Ground on said  
 Almoe Street immediately in the rear of the last mentioned  
 joined premises, together with the appurtenances, both in  
 the City of Philadelphia, To have and to hold and enjoy  
 the same unto the said Susan P. Groves, her heirs and  
 assigns, to and for her and their only proper use and  
 behoof forever. Under and subject nevertheless to the  
 payment of a certain yearly Ground rent sum of one  
 hundred and sixteen Dollars when and as the same  
 shall become due and payable, while I leave these prop-  
 erties unfettered absolutely and freely to my said  
 daughter it is my earnest desire and wish that she  
 shall not encumber them or allow them to be come char-  
 ged with any mortgage or debt of any kind but that  
 she will take care of them for herself, and keep them as  
 a safeguard against want, and I make this request  
 only as an appeal to her good judgment and with  
 loving solicitude for her welfare. Item From and imme-  
 diately after the decease of my said wife, Margaret  
 Gunnodo, I give and bequeath unto my granddaughter

Emma Gunnodo, daughter of my son Charles, deceased  
 the sum of Five thousand Dollars to be paid to her, in  
 case she shall be of age at the time of the decease of my  
 said wife. But if she shall not be of age at the time  
 of the decease of my said wife, then I appoint my son  
 in law Robert M. Groves as Trustee for her to whom the  
 said sum of Five thousand Dollars shall be paid by my  
 Executors hereinafter named, he to hold the same for  
 the use, and benefit of my said granddaughter, until  
 she shall arrive at the age of twenty-one years  
 when the principal shall be paid to her and the trust  
 shall cease. During the minority of my said grand-  
 daughter the said Trustee shall invest said sum of Five  
 thousand Dollars and he is hereby authorized to spend  
 the income arising therefrom for the care and education  
 of my said grand daughter, if in his judgment it shall  
 be necessary, and upon her attaining the majority  
 as aforesaid the said Trustee shall pay over to my  
 said granddaughter the principal as aforesaid and  
 all interested and income not expended as aforesaid;  
 Item I give and bequeath unto my son in law, Robert  
 M. Groves, my gold headed cane and unto my grand-  
 son Edward Cooper, Jr. my Gun and all the gunning  
 equipments accompanying it. Item From and  
 after the decease of my said wife, Margaret Gunnodo,  
 I give devise and bequeath all the rest, residue  
 and remainder of my estate, whether real, personal or  
 mixed whatsoever and wheresoever situate as fol-  
 lows: It is my desire that my estate shall be equally  
 divided among my children and to that end I  
 have valued the specific devises hereinbefore made as  
 follows: To Sallie L. Cooper, Real Estate valued at Ten thousand  
 and Dollars (\$10,000.00) To Samuel H. Gunnodo, Real  
 Estate valued at Nine thousand five hundred  
 Dollars; To John T. Gunnodo, Real Estate valued at  
 Ten thousand one hundred Dollars (\$10,100.00) To  
 Ann Virginia Vondenslager Real Estate valued at  
 Nine thousand eight-hundred Dollars; and To  
 Susan P. Groves, Real Estate valued at Ten thousand  
 five hundred Dollars (\$10,500.00). The rest residue and  
 remainder of my estate shall be divided among the  
 said four children so that they shall share and  
 have alike where the devises hereinbefore made are less  
 than Ten thousand five hundred dollars in value, then  
 the person or persons receiving such devises shall first  
 be entitled to have and receive enough out of my  
 residuary estate to make the value of their devise equal  
 to Ten thousand five hundred Dollars and thereaf-
