Third, I leave and name my son Saverio Obrioli as my sole heir of all my property consisting of Real Estate with all the implements and utensile that there might be found at the time of my death and for him to use such implements and utensils as if they were his own, due to him as he always assisted me during my life time, also, that my two sons Michael and Joseph aforesaid, cannot contest the above and suppose for them to do or try to do anything against their brother Saverio, as they have to be satisfied of what I bequeathed to them, this being my earnest and last wish.

Fourth, I leave nothing to my Daughter Celestina Obrioli, married Luigi Stoppelli, as she received everything due to her at the time of her marriage, and she will not compete for the legacy left by me at my death.

My funeral will be done honorably and the expenses of the same will be divided as follows, my son Saverio with four parts and the other two sons, Michael and Joseph with one part each.

All the above written I Notary Public receive the present Will in the presence of Mr. Giovanni Battista Beretta 61 years old, born at Borgo Sicily, Italy, properties owner, and Nicola D. Pasquale 46 years old, born at Messina, Province of Molise Naples, Italy and both residents of this Borough of Vineland New Jersey, witnesses here present sworn and according to all requisitions of the law. I read the above will and pronounced everything there is in it in the presence of the above parties and being all satisfied.
