

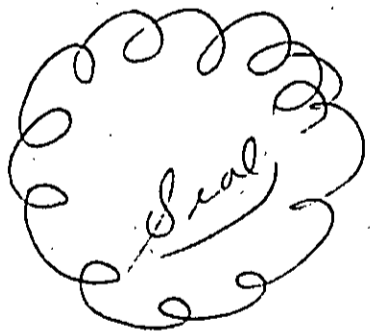
Atlantic County Surrogate's Office.
