Item - I give, bequeath and devise the house and lot on Atlantic Avenue said Atlantic City twenty six feet in width and eighty feet in depth South Eastwardly also the use of the adjoining lot on the South westerly side being about twenty feet wide on Atlantic Ave. and extending of that width about sixty feet South Eastwardly to an open yard to my son William Hayday to be used and enjoyed by him during the term of his natural life and from and immediately after his death I give, bequeath and devise the same to Grand children in equal shares and in case of any said Grand children dying before me her his or their shares shall be divided equally among their lawful issue per stirpe.

Item. I give, devise and bequeath the House furniture and lot situate n<sup>o</sup> 8 Illinois Avenue aforesaid, being thirty five feet wide and One Hundred in depth South Westwardly with right of way to an open yard in rear of the House fronting on Atlantic Avenue to my Grand daughter Matilda Wiley her heirs and assigns forever.

And. I do hereby constitute and appoint as sole executor of this my will. my son George Hayday Junior with full power to appoint his successors.
