The last Will of Margaret B. Kimber.

Be it known and remembered: That I, Margaret B. Kimber of the City of Newport and State of Rhode Island, being of lawful age, and of sane mind, for the ready and effectual settlement of my worldly affairs and estate, do make and ordain this as, and for my last will and Testament in manner and form as follows, viz:

1<sup>st</sup> I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon as conveniently may be after my decease.

2<sup>nd</sup> I give, devise and bequeath one quarter of all my estate, real and personal of what kind so ever and where so ever situate, to my husband Anthony M. Kimber his heirs and assigns forever.

3<sup>rd</sup>. I give, devise and bequeath one quarter of all my estate, real and personal of what kind so ever, and where so ever situate unto my daughter Joanna Sophia Buffum her heirs and assigns for ever.

4<sup>th</sup> I give, devise and bequeath to my daughter in law Maria B. Kimber one quarter of all my estate, real and personal of what kind so ever and where so ever situate, her heirs and assigns for ever.

5<sup>th</sup> I give, devise and bequeath to my son John S. Kimber one quarter of all my estate, real and personal of what kind so ever situate his heirs and assigns for ever.

6<sup>th</sup> And further it is my will that in case of the death of any one of the legatees or devisees under this will that the lawful

heirs of those who are dead shall take the share of the deceased legatee or devisee.

7<sup>th</sup> I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my husband Anthony M. Kimber and my son John S. Kimber as executors of this my last will and testament and request that their personal bond for the payment of my debts, and the settlement of my estate without any surety, be accepted by the Court of Probate by which this my last will and testament may be proved, and admitted to record; also that if I should leave any letter or written directions respecting the disposition of my property or concerning any other matter, not repugnant to or inconsistent with the provisions hereof, that they will cause such directions to be carried out as far as practicable but without account to any court for any distribution made by virtue of this proviso herein contained.

Lastly: I do hereby revoke and annul all other and former wills made by me, and do hereby establish this and this only as and for my last will and testament.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty sixth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven A.D. 1887.
