

I also give and bequeath unto my Loving Daughter, Hannah S. Smith, a Judgment Bond of Seven Hundred Dollars, which I now hold against her husband Edward A. Smith said Bond bearing date April first A.D. 1892, together with all the accrued interest due thereon at the time of my Death.

Item. I also give devise and bequeath unto my Loving Daughter Hannah S. Smith; the one-fourth part, it being all of my interest, which I now hold in common in a Cranberry bog, as a copartner with Thomas S. Wilson, and Thomas Platt, I also give devise and bequeath unto her my Daughter, the one third (1/3) part it being all of my interest which I now hold in common in one other cranberry bog and lands, as a copartner with Thomas Platt and Joseph Strickler, situate in Burlington County, and State aforesaid, and to her heirs and assigns forever, or to her legal Representatives.

Item, I also give and bequeath unto her my said Daughter, Ten (10) shares, of stock in the Ocean City Association, and corporation and to her heirs and assigns forever or to her legal Representatives.

Lastly,

I do hereby appoint as my Executors, to this my last Will and Testament, my son, Dr. John R. Fleming - also my son in law - Edward A. Smith, also my Brother in Law the Hon. Solomon F. Stanger of Glassboro Glb. Co., New Jersey.
