


change and alter investments, or to continue my present investments as he may deem advisable and for the last interests of the said trust estate, I direct that the said trustee and his successors shall act without giving security.

Fifth - It is my will and I do hereby expressly direct and order that if it is necessary for the proper maintenance and support of my said daughter, the said trustee shall expend in that behalf, all or so much as may be necessary of the capital of said trust estate, and this notwithstanding anything else herein to the contrary.

Sixth - I appoint my son Edward G. Reiley, executor of this my last will and testament.
