In the matter of the Probate of the alleged Will of Henry Orphall, deceased } Order For Probate.

Application having been made by Gottlieb Orphall for probate of the last Will of Henry Orphall deceased, and Letters of Administration thereon, and the surrogate having inquired into the circumstances and taken proof, and being satisfied of the genuineness of the Will produced, the validity of its execution and the competency of the testator and the probate of said Will not having been contested and it appearing that the testator died more than ten days ago, it is, on this twelfth day of June A.D. 1897 adjudged that the instrument offered for probate in this matter is the last Will and Testament of Henry Orphall deceased, and the same is hereby admitted to probate; and it is ordered that Letters of Administration be issued thereon to Gottlieb Orphall with the will annexed who may qualify thereunder.

Know all Men by these Presents that we, Gottlieb Orphall, John Brasch and George F. Breder, of Egg Harbor City all of the county of Atlantic, State of New Jersey, are held and firmly bound unto the surrogate of the State of New Jersey, in the sum of Fourteen hundred dollars to be paid to the said surrogate general or his assigns; to which payment well and truly to be made we bind ourselves, our and each of our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals, and dated this twelfth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety seven.

The condition of this obligation is such, that whereas the surrogate of the county of Atlantic, State of New Jersey, has appointed Gottlieb Orphall administrator with the will annexed, of the estate of Henry Orphall deceased, Now, therefore, if the above bounden Gottlieb Orphall Administrator as aforesaid, do make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said Gottlieb Orphall or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for the said Gottlieb Orphall and the same so made, do exhibit into the surrogate's Office of the county of Atlantic, State of New

Jersey, at or before the expiration of three calendar months from the date of the above written obligation, and the same goods, chattels and credits, and all other goods, chattels and credits, of the said deceased, at the time of his death, which at any time after shall come into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for the said Gottlieb Orphall do well and truly administer according to law, and further do make or cause to be made a just and true account of her administration, within one year from the date of the above written obligation; and all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels and credits which shall be found remaining upon the account of the said administration, the same being first examined and allowed by the judges of the Orphans Court of the county, or other competent authority, shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively as is, are or shall by law be entitled to receive the same; then the above obligation to be void and of none effect, or else to remain in full force and virtue.
