I do hereby ratify and confirm my said will in all respects, save so far as any part thereof shall be revoked or altered by this present codicil, and in particular save so far as the same relates to Paragraph Five, in which I bequeath unto my mother-in-law, Louise Keiter, the sum of Two dollars per week, to be paid to her until her death or until my estate becomes exhausted, if that should previously happen, and I hereby charge my estate with the payment of the same; as to which particular item I hereby revoke and alter my said will so that it reads as follows: "I give and bequeath unto my mother-in-law, Louise Keiter, the sum of Two dollars per week, to be paid to her as long as she shall stay and live with my beloved wife, Viola, and not leave her except with her consent expressly given by my said wife; and also that the said weekly allowance of Two dollars shall cease and payment thereof be stopped when she dies or my estate becomes exhausted, if that should previously happen"

And I do hereby revoke all former and other codicils by me at any time heretofore made.
