

Will of John W. Green.

Be it Remembered,

That I, John W. Green, of Pleasantville, Atlantic County, State of New Jersey, being of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, and considering the uncertainty of life, do therefore make, publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following, that is to say:

Item: First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Ruth Green, all of my real and personal property, that is to say, my house and two lots and all of my personal effects, during her natural life.

Second: At the death of my wife Ruth Green, I give and bequeath to my wife's grand-daughter Ruth McGunder No 1 lot and house to have and hold forever. The lots as above mentioned are fully described in my deed.

Third, I give and bequeath to Addie Ward my grand daughter, Lot no 2 adjoining the above said No 1 lot and house to be hers forever.

And as to all the rest, residue and remainder of my Estate, real, personal or mixed, of whatever nature or kind, or wheresoever situate at the time of my decease, I do hereby give, devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Ruth Green to have and to hold or dispose of as she may deem best.

And lastly, I do make, constitute and appoint Rev Thomas J. Oliver now of Pleasantville, Atlantic County, State of New Jersey, to be the Executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills and Testaments by me at any time heretofore made, and declaring this to be my last Will and Testament.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereto subscribed my name, and affixed my seal, the 30th day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety seven.
