I give and bequeath to my nephews and nieces, some twelve in number, being the children of my brothers John Morris and Anthony Morris, deceased, the sum of One Thousand Dollars each, I have heretofore given my relatives from time to time such sums of money, as with the above is just to my family.

After payment of said legacies, any Balance remaining of my Estate I direct my Executor to distribute one half of the said balance *ex equo* among the house for the aged and the Asylum at Hopewell, and the other half *ex equo* among the other bequests and legacies.

Second. As to the Hall of the Morris Guards and the grounds thereof, I direct my Executor to execute a lease to them in perpetuity at a nominal rent, conditioned to maintain the same as an Army and for other creditable and popular public purposes, as heretofore and in the event of its ceasing to be so used and occupied it shall revert to and become part of the residuary estate.

Third, I authorize and empower my Executor to sell all my real and personal estate, either at public or private sale as he may deem for the best interest of the estate.

Fourth, I nominate, constitute and appoint Pierce Archer of Philadelphia as my Executor of this my Last Will and Testament, and I direct that my Executor be not required to give security.
