

scriptions placed on said monument or grave stones to their memory. I do however expressly stipulate that not over eight hundred dollars shall be expended for the purpose aforesaid. I direct my executor to pay to my beloved wife Lucie W. Holt the sum of twenty dollars annually which sum for so much thereof as may be necessary is to be expended by her for the purpose of keeping the same in good order and condition. Said annual payments to continue during the lifetime of my said wife and after her death I give and bequeath the sum of four hundred dollars unto the West Laurel Hill Cemetery Company and its successors in trust to invest the same and apply the income thereof as it shall accrue to the keeping of said lot in said West Laurel Hill Cemetery in good order and condition, forever and foreverly maintain the ground monument or gravestone as well as the inscriptions therein. The lot I now own in Mount Moriah Cemetery I direct my executor to sell at either public or private sale as to them may seem best and place the proceeds to the credit of my estate.

Item II I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Lucie W. Holt all articles of personal, domestic or household use or ornament excepting such as are hereinafter otherwise disposed of including all my furniture books pictures plate jewelry and all household effects which at the time of my decease shall be in about or belong to the house which may at the time of my decease be my place of residence. Also my wardrobe such as my clothing and wearing apparel as she may desire to keep.

Item III To my daughter Florence I give and bequeath my watch and chain and the right of haunting of myself upon her attaining the age of twenty-one years

Item IV To my brother Edward Holt I give and bequeath the sum of five hundred dollars to be paid to him within one year from the date of my death first deducting however such sum for expense as I may have charged against him during my lifetime. I also give and

bequeath to my said brother Edward Holt all such of my clothing and wearing apparel as my beloved wife Lucie W. may or may not desire to keep. Said legacy to my brother Edward Holt and any other legacy or annuity he may receive under the provisions of this will shall not be subject to the debts or liabilities of said Edward Holt nor shall any payment be anticipated. I also desire to extend the right of burial to my said brother Edward in my lot in West Laurel Hill Cemetery.

Item V I give and bequeath my fireman's equipments to the Volunteer Fireman's Association of Philadelphia.

Item VI All the rest residue and remainder of my estate real and personal and mixed I give devise and bequeath unto my executor hereinafter named in trust to invest the money in good and marketable securities so long as they may deem it to the best interests of my estate; to keep and manage the real estate as promises the best return and to collect the income or profits of the entire estate and after deducting the necessary expenses to pay the half of the net income thereof to my beloved wife Lucie W. Holt for and during the term of her natural life or so long as she shall remain my widow and unmarried.

The other half of the said net income is to be paid to my daughter Florence or such other child or children of mine as may survive per share and share alike.

The share which my said wife Lucie W. Holt is to take she shall receive upon her own receipt

and the portion for my daughter Florence or other child or children shall be paid to their guardian so long as they shall remain minors or under the age of twenty-one years and upon their attaining their majority to be received by them upon their own receipts respectively. Said guardian to use so much of said money as may be required for the support maintenance and education of said child or children.
