Interrogatory 5th. Is John Harrold, one of the subscribing witnesses to said paper living or dead; if dead, is his signature his true and genuine signature and did you see him sign it?

In the matter of the Probate of a testamentary writing alleged to be the last will and testament of Peter A. Keller, late of the East Pennsboro Township, in the County of Cumberland, and State of Pennsylvania, deceased.

Deposition of witnesses produced, sworn and examined on the 18th day of October, A. D. 1890, at Philadelphia, by Edward H. Williamson, Notary Public, by virtue of a commission issuing from the Register of Wills of the County of Cumberland, to him directed, for the examination of witnesses in the above stated matter of the probate of the last will and testament of Peter A. I am well acquainted with his signature, having frequently seen him write his name, and the signature attached to said will in attestation thereof as his was made by him in my presence and is his true and genuine signature.

John S. Lawson answers that he has no knowledge on the subject.
