Mr. McCowen: At the hearing before the Register, the subscribing witnesses to the will were cross examined, and their testimony was to this effect, that the will was executed March 14th, 1898, and that the decedent died on the 21st day of March, 1898.

By Mr. McCowen:

Q. Mr. News, where do you reside?

A. 1221 South 7th.

Q. Were you a witness to the will of William J. Headlam?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Did you sign the will as a witness?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. And what day of the week and what month, and what day of the month?

A. It was on Monday the 14th day of March 1898, between the hours of eleven and twelve o'clock.

Q. When and where did you sign the will?

A. In Mr. Headlam's house, in his bedroom.

Q. Where is that house?

A. In Manton Street, back of 622, I think it is.

Q. And you reside on the corner of 7th and Manton?

A. On the corner of 7th and Manton.

Q. Where did he die?

A. He died on the 21st day of March 1898.

Q. And that was one week after he signed it?

A. And that was one week after he signed the will.

Q. How long have you known him?

A. Ever since he was born.

Q. And you have been residing in that locality for how many years?

A. Well, over fifty years.

Q. How old was Mr. Headlam when he died?

A. He was in his forty-eighth year.
