"Will of William Eisenbrey"  
Copy of Will.

In the Name of God, Amen: I, William Eisenbrey, now residing at #1808 Race street, in the city of Philadelphia, being of sound mind, memory and understanding, and fair health, but fully impressed with the uncertainty of life, do make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking, recalling and declaring as null, void, and of no effect whatsoever, all former wills by me at any time heretofore made, and declaring this only to be and contain my last will and testament, as follows:

First: I will and direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses shall be fully satisfied out of my estate, as soon as they conveniently may be after my decease.

Second: I give and bequeath to my daughter, by legal adoption, Adele Eisenbrey Lawson, wife of John L. Lawson, of the city of Philadelphia, now living and who has been living with me since her early childhood, all of my household goods, chattels, furniture, utensils, wearing apparel and jewelry and ornaments of whatsoever nature and kind in and belonging to my residence at the time of my decease, for her to have, hold, use and dispose of the same as she may see proper.

Third: I give and devise to my nephew, John C. Garrett, son of my sister Mary Ann Garrett, his heirs and assigns forever, my dwelling house and premises, situated at #149 No. 5th street, below Race street, which was formerly the property of The Price estate; and my store property and ground at the S. E. corner of 5th & Race streets, in the city of Philadelphia, including the properties on the rear fronting on 5th street, numbered 151 and 153, which I purchased from John A. Elkinton.

Fourth: I give and bequeath unto my wife's sister, Sarah Woodfield, of Savannah, in the State of Georgia, if living at the time of my decease, the sum of Three
