

tively to balance the same w<sup>h</sup>o being above the age of twenty one years and all present were called before us and the choice was given to them first to have the choice put up at vendue and that the highest bidder should be entitled to the first choice and what was given for the choice should be equally divided between the four legatees and or to have the house and lot sold at vendue and the money equally divided between the 4. sons payable one year from the approval of the report by the Orphan Court with interest from the time of approval they all four un-animously chose the first proposition and public outcry was made by Barker Cole Philip Emanuel & Hosea Joslin gave ten minutes for the limitation of the bidding for the choice of each share for the first choice David S. Harbet bid one hundred dollars it being the highest bid it was struck off to him he chose the house lot number 19, the second choice was next set up and Elias S. Harbet bid eighty dollars being the highest and best bid it was struck off to him he chose number 21, the third choice was put up and Edward L. Harbet bid one dollar being the highest bidder it was struck off to him he chose No. 20, and number 18, was left for William B. Harbet all which four numbers we have set off to said legatees by their paying the three fourths of what they bid for the benefit of the other three retaining one fourth part of the same for their part or share of said money the courses and distances of the said numbers will be more fully set forth hereafter together with the other numbers that we have set off to the said seven legatees respectively from number 1. to No. 29. respectively, First we have set off to Elias S. Harbet numbers twenty one twenty seven twenty nine sixteen and one, as follows viz. Number twenty one Beginning at a stake and stone corner of Edward L. Harbet's No. 20. and running his line (1) South seventy degrees West twenty one chains and sixty four links to a stake in the line of J. Stulls Mill pond thence (2) by the same North thirteen degrees East seventy links (3) North ten and a half degrees East seventy eight links (4) North twenty two and a half degrees East one chain and thirty six links (5) North ten degrees East one chain and twenty five links (6) North seventeen degrees East eighty seven links (7) North twenty seven and one fourth degrees West one chain and twenty five links (8) North twenty and a quarter degrees East one chain and ninety six links (9) North twenty degrees East one chain (10) North nineteen degrees West one chain and twenty links (11) North eighteen degrees West fifty links (12) East nineteen chains and thirty nine links to a stump twenty five links West of the road (13) South one degree West three chains and forty six links to the beginning containing by estimation fifteen acres and seventeen hundredths more or less, Number sixteen Begins at a stake & stone corner of Edward L. Harbet twenty five links from the centre of the road and running from thence (1) along his line South seventy degrees West five chains and eighty five links to a stake corner in the line of J. Stulls Mill pond (2) North twenty and a quarter degrees West twenty five links (3) North eighteen and a half degrees West

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chains and thirty six links to a stake corner of Wm B. Harbet lot (4) North seventy degrees East five chains and eighty five links to a stake and stone corner of Wm B. Harbet's twenty five links Westwardly of the centre of the road (5) along the Westwardly side of the road South eighteen and a quarter degrees East two chains and sixty one links to the beginning containing by estimation one and fifty two hundredths acres be the same more or less, Numbers twenty seven and twenty nine are a part of said plantation leased to Jeremiah Stull and his heirs and assigns for the use of a Mill pond the rents of which are set apart by said last will and testament as a fund for the education of his daughter Catharine Ann Harbet until she arrives at the age of eighteen years after which time the rents to be equally divided between the said seven legatees during said continuance of said lease and the soil is divided into seven equal parts and set off to the said seven legatees as hereafter more fully expressed and number twenty seven Begins at a stake & stone corner of number 27 & 28. in the line of No. 18. and line of J. Stulls pond and running (1) along the line of Wm B. Harbet South nineteen degrees East eleven chains and twenty five links to a stake corner of No. 27 & 28. in Dry Run creek thence (2) down the middle of said creek the general course South forty nine degrees West four chains and forty links to a stake corner of No. 26 & 27. thence (3) along the line of No. 27. North nineteen degrees West thirteen chains and forty links to a stake & stone corner of No. 18. 24. 26 & 27. thence (4) along the lines of No. 18. North eighty eight and a half degrees East three chains and sixty nine links (5) North eighty five degrees East fifty nine links to the beginning containing by estimation five acres and five hundredths more or less, Number twenty nine is a piece of about one acre lying between No. 21. and the channel of Great Egg Harbour River and adjoining number twenty one and attached thereto viz. from the end of the 11<sup>th</sup> course of No. 21. it will be South twenty four degrees West four chains and twenty five links (2) South eleven degrees West seventy five links (3) South forty eight degrees East three chains to the line of number twenty one thence (4) along the same to the beginning containing by estimation one acre be the same more or less, Number one Beginning at a stake & stone twenty five links from a gum tree in the edge of the pond and running from thence (1) North twenty three degrees East nine chains to a stake thence (2) North ten and a half degrees West six chains and forty two links to a stump thence (3) North twenty seven and a half degrees East two chains and thirty three links to a pine thence (4) North eighty three and three quarters degrees East three chains and twenty links to the centre of the Rail Road thence (5) North eighty seven and a half degrees East one chain to a pine thence (6) North sixty degrees East ten chains and two five links to a stake corner of No. 1 & 2 in a pond the South nineteen degrees West twenty six links to a stake and stone corner
