First: My Will is that all my just Debts and Funeral Expenses shall be paid out of my Estate as soon after my decease as shall be found convenient.

Second: I give, Devise and Bequeath to my sister Susanna Schubinger of Gainesville, O. my cousins Mary Hutmacher of Omaha, Neb. & Mary Boone of Cleveland, O. and Amalia Lorenz of Cleveland, O. my clothing, bedding and linen in equal shares.

Third: I give and bequeath to Susie Dennerle of Cleveland, O. a distant relative of mine, the picture of my deceased husband and of myself.

Fourth: I give and bequeath to my cousin Mary Hutmacher the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00/00).

Fifth: I give and bequeath to my cousin Francis Fisher of Omaha the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00/00).

Sixth: I give and bequeath to my cousin Susie Phillips of Omaha two hundred dollars (\$200.00/00).

Seventh: I desire, that Nora Boone, daughter of my cousin Mary Boone shall keep my husband's grave and my grave (which shall be at the side of my husband) in Woodland Cemetery, in good order and have them planted with flowers.
