I Edward J. Mc Michan, being sound in mind and body, do make this my last Will and Testament.

First. I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon as conveniently can be after my decease.

Second. I give unto my sister Mary J. Sorvay, wife of Frank Sorvay, the sum of Five hundred (500) Dollars clear of tax.

Third. I desire that my executors shall set apart the sum of Five thousand (5000) Dollars and pay the same unto the Equitable Trust Company, its trust to pay the net income thereof unto my father and mother, James F. Mc Michan and Susan Mc Michan, during the terms of their natural lives. After the death of either one of my said parents, said income shall be paid to the survivor of them for his or her life. After the death of both of my said parents the principal of said fund shall constitute part of my residuary estate, provided however, that if my estate shall realize less than the sum of Ten thousand Dollars the said fund so set apart as provided in this paragraph shall be in lieu of Five thousand Dollars a sum equal to one-fifth of the net amount of my said estate.

Fourth. I give, devise and bequeath any and all the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, of whatsoever kind and wheresoever situated unto my wife Mary E. H. Mc Michan, absolutely and in fee simple.

Fifth. I give and grant unto my executors hereinafter named, full power to sell land and all real estate of which I may die seized either at public or private sale, for such price or prices as they shall deem meet, and without any liability on the part of any purchaser or purchasers to see to the application of the purchase money.

Sixth. I nominate, constitute and appoint my wife Mary E. H. Mc Michan and her brother John H. Gallahan executors of this my last Will
