

said money shall be paid over to said persons within one year from the date of my decease.

Fifth: In lieu of having presented to my son Ernst Kiemle the above mentioned farm etc. he shall pay to my estate the sum of Three hundred dollars, which amount is in full for all demands I have upon him, to be paid one year after my decease.

Seventh: The above bequest of twenty five dollar- to my daughter Mary Ross, is subject to the payment of a note amounting to one hundred and twenty dollars, which she shall pay to my estate.

Eighth: It is my will and I do order that any amount of money over and above the said bequests, and which is left after all bills are paid shall be used to purchase a monument on the cemetery.

Lastly: I constitute and appoint my son Ernst Kiemle, sole Executor of this my last will and testament.

In witness whereof I the said Gottlieb Kiemle, have hereunto set my hand this seventh day of November A. D. nineteen hundred and two.
