

Be it Remembered that I, Hyman H. Ginsburg of the City of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania do make publish and declare this as and for my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. First. I order and direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses shall be fully paid and satisfied by my Executrix hereinafter named as soon after my decease as the same can conveniently be done. Second. Within one year from the date of my death, I direct that my Executrix shall appoint two appraisers, satisfactory to my sons Jacob and Harry, who shall fix the real value of the stock of the Guard Iron and Metal Company belonging to my estate and if my said son Jacob shall continue in the service of the said Company to the satisfaction of the Company for a period of five years from the date of my death, he shall receive in addition to such salary as may be paid to him by the Company such number of shares and fractional parts of a share of the Capital stock of the said Company as shall have a real value, at the time of, and according to said appraisement of five thousand dollars and my son Harry on the same conditions shall receive in addition to his salary such number of shares and fractional parts of a share of the Capital stock of the said Company as shall have a real value at the time of and according to the said appraisement of three thousand dollars. All dividends that may be paid on the said stock until its receipt by the said beneficiaries shall belong to my estate. Third. I give and bequeath the sum of five thousand dollars in cash payable within five years from the date of my death to each of my following named children to wit, Fannie Kate, Abraham, Elizabeth and Samuel. It is my intention that the time at which these legacies shall be paid within the said period shall be entirely discretionary with my Executrix. Fourth. All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate real personal and mixed what soever and wheresoever of which I may be seized and possessed or in any manner entitled at the time of my death, I give devise and bequeath unto my wife Dora Ginsburg her heirs executors and administrators and I request without in any way binding her to do so that she may distribute such an amount among the parties in which I am interested and in such proportions as she may deem proper. Fifth. I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my wife Dora Ginsburg to be the Executrix of this my last Will and the Guardian of the person and estate of any minor children that I may leave to survive me. Lastly. I hereby revoke and make void any and all other Wills by me at any time heretofore
