

my said residuary estate. And upon the death of my said wife, Julia Mc Gee, I bequeath unto my daughter Agnes A. Wiseman the undivided one third (1/3) part of my said residuary estate absolutely, and I direct that forthwith upon the death of my said wife, Julia Mc Gee, that the said Agnes A. Wiseman, as trustee, or her successor, convey to the said Agnes A. Wiseman absolutely, or to her child or children, if she be at that time dead, the undivided one third (1/3) part of my said residuary estate.

And as to the remaining one third (1/3) part of my said residuary estate, I authorize and direct the said Agnes A. Wiseman or her successor, to pay or expend for the education and support and maintenance of my granddaughter, Margaret Gertrude Barry, daughter of my deceased daughter, Julia E. Barry, the income arising from said undivided one third (1/3) part, or so much thereof as shall be reasonably necessary, until such time as the said Margaret Gertrude Barry shall arrive at the age of twenty-one (21) years, if she shall so long live; and upon ~~the~~ arrival of the said Margaret Gertrude Barry at the age of twenty-one (21) years, I direct that the principal of said remaining undivided one third (1/3) part of my said residuary estate, together with the accumulated income thereof, if any, be paid, transferred or conveyed to the said Margaret Gertrude Barry absolutely; and if the said Margaret Gertrude Barry shall die, either before or after the time of my death, before arriving at the age of twenty-one years, leaving a child or children to survive her, I direct that upon her death the principal of said undivided one third (1/3) part of my estate, together with the accumulations, if any, be paid, transferred or conveyed to such child or children in equal shares, but if the said Margaret Gertrude Barry should die, either before or after my death, before arriving at the full age of twenty-one (21) years, without leaving a child or children to survive her, then I direct that upon her death, the principal of said remaining undivided one third (1/3) part of my said residuary estate, and any accumulated income thereof, shall be paid, transferred, conveyed distributed as follows:

To my son, Daniel A. Mc Gee, and my daughter, Agnes A. Wiseman each the undivided one half (1/2) part thereof absolutely; and if either my said son, Daniel A. Mc Gee, or my said daughter, Agnes A. Wiseman, shall then be dead, having left a child or children to survive him or her, or the descendants of any deceased child, then I direct

that such child or children shall take the share which his, her or their parent would have taken if living, but if both my said son, Daniel A. Mc Gee, and my said daughter, Agnes A. Wiseman, shall then be dead, both leaving a child or children to survive him or her, or the descendants of any deceased child, then I direct that one half (1/2) of said remaining undivided one third (1/3) part of my residuary estate be paid, transferred and conveyed to the child or children of my son Daniel A. Mc Gee, or the descendants of any deceased child or children, and the remaining one half (1/2) part thereof paid to the child or children of the said Agnes A. Wiseman, or the descendants of any deceased child or children. And I do further direct that if upon the death of my said grand daughter, Margaret Gertrude Barry, without leaving a child or children to survive her, either the said Daniel A. Mc Gee or the said Agnes A. Wiseman shall then be dead, without having left a child or children or descendants of any deceased child or children to survive him or her, then the share of the one so dying without leaving a child or children, or descendants

of any child or children, to survive him or her, shall be paid, transferred and conveyed to the one living, or his or her children, and the descendants of any deceased child or children, each taking the share which his or her parent would have taken if living.

Fifth. I nominate and appoint my wife, Julia Mc Gee, and my daughter, Agnes A. Wiseman, executrices of this, my last will and testament.
