Bowdle, the other subscribing witness to the said Will, was present at the same time with the deponent when the said will was signed by the said Testator and by him published and declared as and for his last Will and Testament as aforesaid, and that the said Eleanor B. Bowdle and deponent both subscribed their names to said Will as witnesses at the request of and in the presence of the said testator, and in the presence of each other.
