

Twenty first: To Samuel P. Morris the picture of "Battle" painted by M. H. J. Potter.

Twenty second: To Mary H. Porter bramer daughter of Theodore bramer the sum of Fifty Dollars.

Twenty third: To Antoinette Porter and Josephine Porter all my silver and silverware.

Twenty fourth: To Elizabeth Porter and her two daughters Antoinette Porter and Josephine Porter my three black arm chairs.

Twenty fifth: To Lottie Britz the sum of Fifty Dollars.

Twenty sixth: To Emma S. Ingersoll the framed design made by a Prisoner in the State Prison.

The articles mentioned in above items, exclusive of money items are now owned jointly by my sister Elizabeth H. Porter and by myself and if she survive me I request that she join in like manner in devising these items as above set forth.

Twenty seventh: Should William H. Porter or Frank R. Porter be living at the time of my decease then I give to each of the said William H. Porter and Frank R. Porter the sum of Five hundred Dollars.

I hereby direct my Executors to place the sum of Five hundred Dollars at interest and the income therefrom to be used for the purpose of keeping the Porter lot in the Haddonfield Baptist Cemetery in proper condition.

All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, I give to the said Antoinette Porter, Josephine Porter, Lewis S. Porter and Herbert Porter in equal parts, share and share alike.

I constitute and appoint J. Leonard Baier and Robert H. Ingersoll Executors of this my Last Will and Testament and I do give them or to the survivor of them full power and authority to grant, bargain, sell and convey any or all of my lands to any person or persons in fee simple or otherwise at public or private sale at such times and upon such terms as they shall see fit.

And in all other respects I confirm my said Last Will and Testament.
