

## Translation

Public Testament. In the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety two, the 20th day of October, at 6 p.m. in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, United States of America, in my office at 739 South 7th St.

Before me, Emmanuele Perotta, a Notary Public duly authorized for the County of Philadelphia, and in the presence of the undersigned witnesses, to me well known, personally appeared Mrs. Rachele Baniglia, daughter of the late Domenico born in the City of Bari, Province of Bari, Italy, wife of Mr. Stefano Melchiorre, now residing in Hammondon, State of New Jersey, United States of America, and being desirous to settle her worldly affairs now that is of sound disposing mind, does make this her last will and testament, and to that effect, she declares, that after her death, she gives, devise and bequeaths all her property both real and personal credit, deposit in bank etc, of which she may be possessed, to her husband Stefano Melchiorre; said estate wherever situated in Italy or in these United States or elsewhere.

She directs that her funeral shall take place according to the Catholic rite.

She declares this to be her last will and testament, and attestation of her affection to her good husband Stefano Melchiorre.

And I, Notary, requested, have drawn this last will and testament, which according to law has been acknowledged as her act and deed, by said Rachele Baniglia, in the presence of the four witnesses, Domenicantonio Turchi, Giuseppe Troia, Nicola Manzi and Lucio Bianfara, who have signed their names, except Rachele Melchiorre, the testatrix, being illiterate.
