In the Matter of the probate of the last will and testament of Albert Jeanbey deceased. Order For Probate.

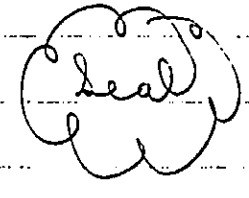
