All the rest residue and remainder of my estate real personal and mixed whatsoever or wheresoever situated I give devise and bequeath to my nephew, John J. Lann and my niece Mary A. Lann, Margaret Lann and Marie A. Lann to be equally divided between them share and share alike.

I nominate and appoint my husband James J. Gillin and my niece Mary A. Lann Executors of this my last Will and Testament and in case of the death of my said husband I substitute in his place my nephew John J. Lann and my niece Margaret J. Lann and Marie A. Lann.
