Ninth. In addition to the bequest hereinbefore made to my nephew Charles D. Dame, I give and bequeath to him six (6) bonds of the Alliance Gas and Electric Company, of Alliance, Ohio; also fifty-four (54) shares of the capital stock of the Copper Range Consolidated Company.

Tenth. I give and bequeath to my namesake, Mary Dame Peters, formerly Mary Dame Kittredge, wife of Professor Peters, of Idaho University, of Moscow, Idaho, ten (10) shares of the capital stock of the Bank of California, of the city of San Francisco, California, to be held and possessed by her as her sole and individual property, free from the control of any husband.

Eleventh. I give and bequeath the sum of Five Hundred (\$500) Dollars to Nellie E. Handly, now in my service, if she shall be in my service at the time of my death.

Twelfth. I give and devise my homestead, situated on Burlingame Avenue, in the city of Detroit, Michigan, to my sister Anna Dame Connor, for and during her natural life, and after her death to the North Congregational Church, of Detroit, Michigan, to be used for a parsonage.

Thirteenth. I give and bequeath to my said sister, Anna Dame Connor, all my furniture, ornaments, bric-a-brac, wardrobe, jewelry, and generally, all my belongings of personal and household use, expressing the hope that she will distribute them among my relatives and friends in accordance with a list to be signed by me, and which will be kept with, and accompany this will. The bequest herein made to my said sister is absolute, and the list which I shall so sign is not intended to limit or qualify it, but merely as an expression of the hope that my sister will distribute the articles set forth in it, in the manner therein specified.

Fourteenth. All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate of every name and nature and wheresoever situated, I give, devise and bequeath as follows: One-third ($\frac{1}{3}$) to my said sister, Mrs. Anna Dame Connor; one-third ($\frac{1}{3}$) to my sister Mrs. Celia Dame Hoole, of Brooklyn, New York; and one-third ($\frac{1}{3}$) to my brother Samuel P. Dame and Mary D. Dame, his wife, of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, jointly, and in the event that either of them shall not be living at the time of my death, the survivor shall take the whole share.

Fifteenth. I appoint as executors of this will, the Honorable Samuel M. Damon, of Honolulu, in the Hawaiian Islands, and the Union Trust Company, of Detroit, Michigan, and request that no bond be required of them as such.

In Testimony Whereof, I have executed this will at the city of Detroit, Michigan, this thirtieth day of August, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five.

I, Mary Dame Hall, of the City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, do make publish and declare this codicil to the foregoing, my last will and testament made and executed by me on the thirtieth day of August, in the year, one thousand nine hundred and five, in manner following, that is to say:

First. I give and bequeath to my friend Miss Cornelia M. Lansing, of Watertown, New York, the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1000.00), as an expression of my affection for her.

Second. I give and bequeath the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2500.00) to Nellie E. Handly, now in my service, if she shall be in my service at the time of my death. This bequest is made to take the place of the bequest made to her in the eleventh paragraph of my said will.

Third. I give and bequeath to my nephew Sester P. Hoole, of Brooklyn, New York, all the shares which I may own at the time of my death in U. F. Vestrander, incorporated, of Philadelphia; also all moneys which I may have on deposit at the time of my death in the Savings Institute called "Thrift" of Brooklyn, New York. This bequest is in addition to the moneys bequeathed to my said nephew in paragraph seventh of my said will and to take the place of the real estate devised to him in said paragraph and which I have now sold.

Fourth. The house and lot devised in the fifth paragraph of my said will to my nephew Dr. Guy S. Connor having been sold, I hereby revoke the devise made in said paragraph.

Fifth. I hereby revoke paragraph fourteenth of said will, disposing of my residuary estate and in lieu thereof, make the following provisions, to wit:

(a) I give and bequeath to my executors named in said will one hundred and sixty-eight (168) shares of the Inter-island Steam Navigation Company of Honolulu, in the Hawaiian Islands, and thirty-three (33) shares of the Paia Sugar Plantation Company of the same place: to take, hold and manage the same, in trust, during the life-time of my sister Mrs. Anna Dame Connor; to collect the income therefrom and to pay over said income to my said sister Anna Dame Connor during her natural life.

After the death of my said sister, I give and bequeath said shares, one-half to my sister Mrs. Celia Dame Hoole of Brooklyn, New York and one-half to my brother Samuel P. Dame and Mary D. Dame, his wife of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, jointly, and to the survivor of them, and if neither of them shall be living, to their issue by right of representation; and I direct my said trustees, upon the death of my said sister Anna Dame Connor, to transfer said shares accordingly.
