All the rest residu and remainder of my Estate of what-soever kind or wheresoever situate real personal and mixed I hereby give devise and bequeath unto my sister Martha A. May in fee simple absolutely.

It is my Will and I expressly desire and direct that my Executor be not required to file any appraisement or Inventory of my Estate

I hereby nominate constitute and appoint my nephew George May sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament in the event however of his death inability or unwillingness to act, then I appoint my friend Bartram Ashmead as such Executor
