Item, I hereby give devise and bequeath to my friend Frank J. Dubois of Philadelphia the sum of One thousand dollar (\$1000) cash.

Item, I hereby give devise and bequeath the net income of all of the rest residue and remainder of my estate real personal and mixed to my two sisters Mary E. May and Martha A. May for and during the whole term of their natural lives share and share alike and the life of the survivor.

Item. At and immediately upon the death of the survivor of my said sisters I hereby give devise and bequeath the entire corpus or principal of my said residuary estate to my niece May Carhuff of Newark New Jersey in fee simple clear of all trusts.

Lastly I hereby nominate constitute and appoint my said friend Frank J. Dubois Executor and Henry R. Edmunds Attorney at Law Trustee under and of this my last will and testament.
