

Second: I give the large life-size picture of my deceased husband, J. H. Leedom, to my nephew Harry D. Lewis, and the smaller one to Amelia C. Taylor, niece of my said deceased husband; and I give the picture of my self and also my watch and chain and my signet ring to Emma P. Smith.

Third: I direct that all the rest and residue of my estate of every kind be equally divided share and share alike between such of the following persons as may survive me, namely:

Lewis, and also the children of the late Emma Taylor and Amelia Dibelar, so that each individual above mentioned or described as a legatee, including each of said children, who may be living at the time of my death, shall receive one equal share, and I give, devise and bequeath the same accordingly.

Fourth: I hereby nominate and appoint my nephews Harry D. Lewis and William Taylor, Jr. to be the executors of this my last will and testament and I request that they and the trustee named in this my will be permitted to act as such respectively without being required to give any bond or other security.

Fifth: I hereby revoke all other wills by me at any time heretofore made, and I do hereby declare this to be my only last will and testament.
