Miner, filed herein, that Pauline Miner, late of the City of Atlantic City in the County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey, died on the 9th day of February, 1909; that Letters of Administration were on the 4th day of March, 1909, granted to Walter H. Miner the only next of kin of said deceased; that subsequently a will of said deceased was discovered, and by an order of the Court dated April 15, 1909, the said Letters of Administration

were revoked; that the said Pauline Miner in and by her last will and testament appointed her husband, Charles C. Miner the executor thereof, but the said Charles C. Miner pre-deceased the said testatrix.

And the Surrogate having inquired into the circumstances, taken proof, and being satisfied of the genuineness of the will produced the validity of its execution, and the competency of the testatrix, and no caveat against the probate of said will having been filed and the said Walter H.
