All the foregoing devises and bequests I make to my said wife with the right to use the whole or any portion of the same that may in her judgment be necessary for her comfort, maintenance or support during her life time, and at the death of my said wife I direct that the principal of the said devises and bequests not expended under this, the provision of my will, by my said wife shall go to my daughter Elizabeth Maylin Newell Sparks in fee simple.

I give, devise and bequeath unto my beloved daughter, the said Elizabeth Maylin Newell Sparks the homestead where I now live and known as No 321 High Street in the City of Millville, New Jersey; also the farm and upland lying along the Cumberland Road and now occupied and leased by Levi De Hart; also the woodland lying along the Cedarville Road, containing about one hundred acres, also all my interest in the Widows and Orphans Association of Medical Men also all notes or obligations now held by Samuel M. Sheldon, the results and receipts of sales of building lots lying along the Budgeton and Millville turnpike, also in lieu of all moneys placed in my hands by my said daughter or her husband, Frank S. Sparks, I give and bequeath to my said daughter the building lot known as the Porcup lot lying on the east side of High Street between Oak and Pine Streets Millville, New Jersey; also all my title to the bond and mortgage now held by me given by the Imperial Realty Company of Camden New Jersey and secured on property No 504 Pacific Avenue in the City of Atlantic City, New Jersey.

Wherewith the above bequests and devises by daughter will cancel and pay off the mortgage on my homestead heretofore devised to her, and now held by the heirs of Jesse Dekey.

I also give and bequeath all my personal property of whatever kind, such as household goods, horses, carriages, coal, coal mine stocks in the Peter Honey Developing Company, guns and books, to my said daughter.

All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate I give, devise and bequeath unto my said wife and my said daughter, to be divided between them, share and share alike.

I hereby appoint my said wife Lida W. Newell and my said daughter Elizabeth Maylin Newell Sparks, executrices of this my last will and testament.
