

my brother James G. Shinn as shall be living at time of my decease, the sum of five thousand dollars to be equally divided among them, share and share alike.

Sixth. I give and bequeath to Lucy H. Hunt of Bridgeton, New Jersey, the sum of five hundred dollars.

Seventh. I give and bequeath unto my Executors and Trustees hereinafter named, the sum of five thousand dollars, in trust, to invest the same in good and sufficient securities and to pay over the income arising therefrom to my friend Mrs. Caroline H. Field during the term of her natural life. At her decease, I direct that the principal of said sum shall form a part of my residuary estate.

Eighth. I request the following named persons, Mrs. Mary W. Saxeby, Mrs. Helen S. Gave, Mrs. Caroline H. Field, Mrs. Mary S. Field, Mrs. M. S. Dodge, Miss Josephine Gaven, Mrs. E. S. Jenbrook, Mrs. Mary A. Bradbury, Mrs. John Stevenson, Lucy H. Sustain, Mary W. de Rosenko and Ambelia W. Haddock, as soon as conveniently may be after my decease, to associate themselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation of the first class under the Act of Assembly of April 29, 1874, and its supplements for the purpose of the care, support and maintenance of infants under the age of three years, one or both of whose parents may be deceased, the preference being given to those infants one or both of whose parents may be members of the Presbyterian Church. I leave the details of the charter and the By-Laws of this proposed corporation to the incorporators and their successors, who shall elect a Board of Managers with power to fill vacancies in their own number, and also to elect their own Officers (both Officers and Managers except Mrs. Helen Saxeby and Mrs. Ambelia W. Haddock to be communicant members of the Presbyterian Church) and also with power to elect an Advisory Board of Clergymen and male communicant members of the Presbyterian Church. It is my desire that the regulations which govern this institution shall conform as nearly as may be to those which govern the Presbyterian Orphanage in the State of Pennsylvania and hereby direct that the institution so created shall be under the care and direction of the Presbytery of the City of Philadelphia, it being my wish and desire that if the said institution shall in time prove inefficient for the purpose of the institution, that the same may be supplemented by contributions from the churches of the Presbytery (so that the same shall be regarded as one of the churches of the Presbyterian Church in Pennsylvania) and further direct that the said corporation shall be known as "The Haddock Memorial" in memory of my husband and children.

Should any or all of the said persons hereinbefore named decline or be unable to act as incorporators I request that such as can so act, shall with my Executor's choice other fit and discreet persons, who shall be members of the Presbyterian Church, to act in the place of those who shall

not be able to serve as aforesaid. I give and devise to my Executors and Trustees hereinafter named, for the purpose of conveying to the said corporation when formed, my house and lot situate on the south side of Pine Street West of Eighth Street, in the City of Philadelphia known as No. 808, with the lot adjoining thereto, and I direct that the said premises shall be used for the purposes aforesaid. I also give and bequeath to the said corporation such house hold furniture, pictures, carpets, &c. in my residence at the time of my decease, which my children may feel willing and disposed to have donated to this object. I further give and bequeath to the said corporation the sum of One hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars, in trust, however to invest and keep the same invested in good and sufficient securities, to collect the interest and income therefrom and to apply the same to the repair and maintenance of the said house and to the support, maintenance and clothing of the infants who may be inmates thereof. It is my wish and I hereby direct, that except under very special circumstances no infant shall be retained or kept in said home after it shall have attained the age of three years, it being my desire that at such periods, the child shall be transferred to the Presbyterian Orphanage in the State of Pennsylvania under such arrangements with the said Orphanage as may thereafter be agreed upon. Until the premises No. 808 Pine Street shall be conveyed to the corporation to be formed in accordance with the terms of my will I desire that the same shall be kept open under the superintendence and care of Mrs. Caroline H. Field or such other competent person as my daughters shall determine the expenses of keeping the same open and the food, wages and services of the care taker and servants to be paid by my Executor out of my estate.

Ninth. I give and bequeath to the Presbyterian Orphanage of which I am President, the sum of Twenty thousand dollars and I direct that such portion of the income of the same as shall be necessary shall be expended to keep the grounds and buildings in good order and repair.

Tenth. I give and bequeath to the Philadelphia Branch of the Woman's Trunk Missionary Society of America, of which I am President, the sum of five thousand dollars.

Eleventh. I give and bequeath to the Sea Side Home for Women and Children at Cape May Point, of which I am President the sum of five thousand dollars.

Twelfth. I give and bequeath to the Woman's Bible Reading Society of Philadelphia, of which I am President the sum of five thousand dollars.

Thirteenth. I give and bequeath to the Presbyterian Home for Widows and Single Women in the State of Pennsylvania, the sum of three thousand dollars, for the endowment of a room to be filled from time to time
