

forms of acquittances and in case of the sale by them of the whole or any part of said trust estate the purchaser or purchasers are hereby expressly released from all liability of obligation to see to the application of the purchase money. The income to be derived from the investment of this trust fund is to be paid over to the said Sophie Dallas Hazeltine during her natural life at least once every six months upon her own order or receipt, and upon the decease of the said Sophie Dallas Hazeltine the said principal trust fund and all earnings and accumulations thereon then remaining in the hands of said trustees or their successors in said trust, after deducting the expenses incident to the trust, is to be paid over to the legatee or legatees and devisee or devisees mentioned in the will of Sophie Dallas Hazeltine which I earnestly hope she will make. In the event of my daughter Sophie Dallas Hazeltine dying without leaving a will then said trust funds and all earnings and accumulations thereon then remaining in the hands of said trustees or their successors in said trust after deducting expenses of said trust, I direct the trustees Richard Wainwright and Paul C. Johnson to divide equally between the home for the incurables of Washington D.C. and St. Johns Episcopal Orphanage of Washington D.C. In the event of my daughter Sophie Dallas Hazeltine dying without leaving a will I direct the trustees Richard Wainwright and Paul C. Johnson or their successors in this trust, to pay her funeral expenses and all of her just debts which are presented within six months of her death.

I hereby revoke any will by me at any time heretofore made. I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint Captain Richard Wainwright and Paul C. Johnson, Executors of this my last will and testament.
