Sixth - I give my executors and trustees full power, and authority to sell any or all my real estate at public or private sale, upon such terms and conditions as to them may seem advisable and to give good and sufficient deeds in law therefor with no obligation on the part of the purchaser or purchasers as to the application of the purchase money.

I also give my executors and trustees full power and authority to sell any of the securities belonging to my estate and to invest the proceeds or any other money that may be in their hands from time to time, in first mortgages or municipal bonds.

Seventh - I hereby appoint my wife Martha A. Parker and the Guarantee Trust Company of Atlantic City, executors of this my last will and testament, neither of which executors shall be required to give bond for the performance of their duties.
