Also give my executors and trustees full power and authority to sell any of the securities belonging to my estate and to invest the proceeds of any other money that may be in their hands from time to time, in first mortgaged or municipal bonds.

Seventh - I hereby appoint my wife Martha A. Parker and the Guarantee Trust Company of Atlantic City, exec-
utors of this my last will and testament, neither of which executors shall be required to give bond for the performance of their duties.
