SEVENTH.

It is my will and I do order that my executors hereinafter named, shall pay to the City of Egg Harbor City the sum of Three hundred dollars, to be held in trust and securely invested and put out on interest by the Common Council of said Egg Harbor City, or the governing body thereof, and that the yearly interest of the said sum of Three hundred dollars (\$300.) shall be expended by the said Common Council or other governing body of said Egg Harbor City, for keeping the cemetery lot where my wife and myself shall be interred in proper condition and for the ornamenting of the graves therein.

EIGHTH.

I give and devise to my said wife, the lot and buildings thereon, known as Nos. 1907 and 1909 Atlantic Avenue, Atlantic City, N.J. being forty feet front on Atlantic Avenue, by one hundred and fifty feet deep, for and during her natural life, and after her decease I give and devise the same to my son, Gustav Kessler, to him, his heirs and assigns forever.

NINTH.

I give and devise to my son, Gustav Kessler, the lot and buildings thereon, known as Nos. 1911 and 1913 Atlantic Avenue, Atlantic City, N.J. being fifty feet front on Atlantic Avenue, by one hundred and fifty feet deep, to him, his heirs and assigns forever; subject however to the provision that my wife, Wilhelmina Kessler, shall be entitled to use, occupy and enjoy the dwelling portion of No. 1913 Atlantic Avenue for and during her natural life, unless she shall relinquish her right to do so in writing.

TENTH.

I also give and bequeath unto my niece, Louise Geigis, hereinbefore named, the bond and mortgage which I hold upon the property of the German Presbyterian Church of Atlantic City, N.J. for Fifteen hundred dollars.

ELEVENTH.

I give and bequeath unto my niece, Carrie Obergfell, the sum of Two thousand dollars (\$2000.).

TWELFTH.

I give and bequeath the sum of One thousand dollars (\$1000.) to each of the following: Unto my nephew, William Huber; Unto my niece, Lizzie Niemeyer; Unto my sister, Henrietta Kessler; and unto my niece, Nettie, daughter of my brother Emil.

THIRTEENTH.

I give and bequeath all the residue and remainder of my personal property to my said wife, Wilhelmina Kessler, with full power to dispose of the same by gift or will, in such manner as she may deem just and proper.

LASTLY.

I hereby nominate and appoint Albert C. Stephany and my son, Gustav Kessler, co-executors of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking any and all wills at any time by me heretofore made.
