Know all Men by these Presents, that I James W. Hinkle of the City of Philadelphia, in the County of Philadelphia, and state of Pennsylvania, Hatter, being of sound mind, memory and understanding, do make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time hereto fore made.

Imprimis. I direct all my just debts and funeral expenses to be fully paid and satisfied by my executrix hereinafter named as soon as conveniently may be after my decease

Item:- All the rest residue and remainder of my estate, real personal, and mixed, whatsoever and wheresoever, I order and direct to be converted into money as soon as the same can conveniently be done after my decease.

And when the whole of my said estate shall be converted into money as aforesaid then I will and direct that the same shall be divided as follows, to wit: one full equal third part or share thereof I give, devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Almira Isemminger Hinkle absolutely.
