1. I hereby substitute in the place and stead of the second paragraph of said will the following:

Second: All my lands and premises situate lying and being northwardly of the Main County Road leading to Chestnut Neck, also my lower meadows and fish place, I give unto my sons James H. Johnson and E. Bartine Johnson and unto my grandchildren, Marie A. Johnson and Ruth T. Johnson, a one third undivided interest in same to vest in James H. Johnson a one third interest to vest in E. Bartine Johnson and the remaining one third interest to vest equally in said Marie A. and Ruth T. Johnson it hereby being my intention to change the said Clause in my will by substituting in the said second clause thereof the names of Ruth T. and Marie A. Johnson in the place and stead of W. Scott Johnson.

I hereby ratify and confirm my said last will and testament of April 6th, 1912 in all respects except as same is hereby modified.
