I, GEORGIA B. McILHENNY of No 220 West Upsal Street, Philadelphia Pennsylvania, do make this my last will and Testament as follows:-

I give to the Trustees of Summit Presbyterian Church Five Hundred Dollars to be invested by them, and the income to be given each year to the Sunday School.

To my sister Isabel McIlhenny Nichols, I give my large three stone diamond ring as a keepsake.

To my brother John Dexter McIlhenny I give any piece of jewelry he may select To my brother Francis Salisbury McIlhenny I give one fourth of my entire estate if he survive me. To each child of my brother Francis Salisbury McIlhenny, I give the sum of Five thousand dollars.

All the rest, residue and remainder of my property, real personal and mixed, I give, devise and bequeath to my sister Selina Bell McIlhenny absolutely and in fee simple. In event of her not surviving me, I give, devise and bequeath all of my said residuary estate to my brother, Francis Salisbury McIlhenny.

I appoint my sister Selina Bell McIlhenny and my brother Francis Salisbury McIlhenny to be the executors of this my last will.

I declare this to be my last will and Testament and revoke all former wills heretofore by me made.

I, GEORGIA B. McILHENNY, of the City of Philadelphia, do make this Codicil to my said last will and Testament as follows: Since the making of my last will, the Will of my father, if he left a valid one, has become operative by reason of his death, although his will has not been proved. I therefore hereby exercise any right or appointment that I may have to dispose of by Will of any income or principal from my father's estate, and I direct that if my interest in his estate is principal that in such case I hereby give devise and bequeath said principal in exactly the same way and under the same limitations and Trusts as is provided for in my will for my other property which shall be part of my residuary estate. If I have the right only to dispose of income from my father's estate, I direct that such income shall be paid under the same limitations to the same persons as would be entitled to the income of my other estate at the time. And at such time as my principal share from my father's estate is distributed then in such case the said principal shall go to the same person or persons and in the same way and shares and under the same limitations and Trusts as if I had been absolutely possessed

of such principal at the time of my death.
