

Ten thousand dollars (\$10,000..)

Fifth, I give and bequeath to my sisters Anna Arata and Maria Camia the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000..) each

Sixth. I give,devise and bequeath all the rest, residue and remainder of my estate,real, personal or mixed, whatsoever and wheresoever the same may be or consist of at the time of my decease,to my brothers Zefferino Nassano, Joseph Nassano and Antonio Nassano, to be equally divided between them share and share alike absolutely and in fee simple

Seventh, Whereas my brother David Nassano being well fixed in this life and in comfortable circumstances,it is my will that he shall not share in nor have any claim on any part of my estate.

eighth. Should I own share of stock of any kind at the time of my decease, it is my desire that my executors be not required to sacrifice them by immediate sale but that they may carry the same,or any part thereof until such time as they are able to dispose of them advantageously.

Ninth. In case my nephew Zefferino Camia,above named,should die before me without leaving child or children living at the time of my decease then and in that event I direct that the sum of Ten thousand Dollars (\$10,000--) bequeathed to the said Zefferino Camia by the fourth item hereof,shall be paid to the brothers and sisters of the said Zefferino Camia who may be living at the time of my decease,in equal shares.

Tenth. I do hereby appoint my said brother Antonio Nassano, my said nephew Zefferino Camia and my said niece Mary Nassano to be executors and executrix of this my last will and Testament. Inasmuch as all of my said executors are remembered in the distribution of my estate as set forth in this my Will,it is my will that they act as executors hereof without making any charge for commissions,and in lieu thereof I direct that they be paid the sum of Two hundred dollars (\$200--\$ each for their services,to be paid out of the Residue of my estate.

I, Angelo Nassano, of Atlantic City, in the State of New Jersey, being of sound, disposing mind, memory and understanding, do hereby make, publish and declare, this Codicil to my Last Will and Testament (dated September 1, 1910) as follows to wit:

First: I give and bequeath unto my nephew Zefferino Camia the sum of Five thousand dollars (\$5,000:) in addition to the sum of Ten thousand dollars (\$10,000:) given to him in the Fourth item of said will.

Second: My said sister Maria Camia, having since died, I direct that the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000), given to her by the Fifth item of said Will, be divided equally between her four children hereinafter named, viz, Dolina Calli (nee Camia) Angelina Marconi (nee Camia) Massimo Camia and Ernesto Camia.

Third: My said brother Joseph Nassano having since died, I hereby give, devise and bequeath the share given him by the Sixth item of said Will, (being a one third share of my estate, real, personal and mixed)

unto the children of my said brother Joseph Nassano, who may be living at the time of my decease, to be divided among them share and share alike.

Fourth: I have gone over the matters of my estate and the division and distribution thereof very carefully, It is my will and I hereby direct that in case of a contest of any kind, the share of any such contestant or contestants shall thereupon become forfeited, and such share become part of my residuary estate in which said contestant or contestants shall not share.

I, Angelo Nassano, of the City of Atlantic City, in the County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this as a second codicil to my last will and testament.

1. I desire to amplify clause 2 of my will of September, 1st, 1910, and, therefore give and bequeath unto my niece, Mary Nassano, daughter of my deceased brother, Giovanni, the sum of twenty thousand dollars instead of twelve thousand dollars as therein stated.

2. The Nassano homestead, with all the furniture and fixtures therein contained, including the five pieces of land on which is the virgia, olive and castague groves, and the Villa Detto ~~with~~ ^{with} the little house, and all other land, real estate and ~~houses~~ ^{houses}, which I own in the town, ^{or comune} of Orero, in the County of di Cicagua, in the Province of di Genova, in the kingdom Italy, I give, bequeath and devise unto my said niece, Mary Nassano, to have and to hold for and during her natural life, and after her death I give, bequeath and devise the same unto my nephew, Dr Angelo Nassano, son of my brother, Joseph .of Vogera, in the province of Pavia, in said Kingdom of Italy, to have and to hold unto him and his heirs and assigns forever.

3. I revoke clauses 5 and 6 of my said will of September 1st, 1910 and 1, 2 and 3 of my codicil of April 2nd, 1913 and in lieu thereof all the rest and residue of my estate, real, personal and mixed, whatsoever and wheresoever the same may be, I direct shall be divided unto five equal parts, and I give, bequeath and devise one such part unto the children of my deceased brother, Zefferino, or their heirs and assigns, in equal shares; another such part unto the children of my deceased brother Joseph, or their heirs and assigns, in equal shares; another such part unto my brother Antonio, or his heirs and assigns; another such part unto the children of my deceased sisters, Maria Camia, or their heirs and assigns, in equal shares and another such part unto my sister, Anna Arata, or her heirs and assigns.

4 In all other respects I ratify and confirm the provisions in my said will and first codicil contained.
