

Sixth: All the rest residue of my estate, whether real or personal, wherever situate, after the payment of all legacies by this my last will and testament, I give devise and bequeath in equal parts to my beloved daughters, Mrs Elizabeth Bradley, now residing in Atlantic City, New Jersey, and Mrs. Anna Smith, now residing in the City of Philadelphia, Pa., share <sup>and</sup> share alike.

Seventh: I hereby empower my executor to make such disposition of my estate as may seem to him for the best interests of my heirs and for that purpose I do hereby give unto my executor full power and authority to grant, bargain, sell and convey, any or all of my estate, real and personal, and to invest and reinvest the proceeds thereof in any manner as in his judgment may seem proper.

Eighth: It is my desire that a railing should be placed around my burial lot in North Cedar Hill Cemetery with stepping stone bearing my name, and should I not accomplish this during my natural life, then I direct my executor to have such work completed.

I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint Joseph A. McNamee of Atlantic City, New Jersey to be executor of this my last will and testament, written on three sheets of paper to serve without bond, during the term of his natural life, and after his death I hereby constitute and appoint Marine Trust Company of Atlantic City, New Jersey, to be executor of this my last will and testament, with all the powers conferred by this instrument upon my executor said Marine Trust COMPANY to serve without bond.
