

surviving sisters and brother, or their descendants - the descendants of the deceased brother or sister to represent their deceased parent and take per stirpes.

ITEM FIFTH: I hereby give and grant unto said Trust Company of Georgia, as Trustee in connection with the trust created in the preceding items of this will, full and complete power from time to time to sell any of the property belonging to my estate, either at public or private sale, and to invest and reinvest the proceeds thereof, provided that it shall at all times be invested in loans secured by mortgages, deeds or other liens upon Atlanta real estate, procuring on said loans the very best rate of interest which the trustee may be able to arrange for, keeping in mind the safety of the loans.

ITEM SIXTH: I nominate and appoint the Trust Company of Georgia as Executor of this my last will and testament, and direct that it shall gather together my estate as soon as practicable, pay off my just debts, including my burial expenses and the expenses of my last illness, and as promptly as possible turn over to itself as Trustee the remainder of my said estate, to be administered as hereinbefore provided for, and while acting as Executor it shall have authority to make sales of any property belonging to my estate, either at public or private sale, upon such terms as it may see fit.
